Since 2014, an international performance art network has developed, which began in Chiang Mai in Thailand. Since then, performance art encounters or festivals have taken place in Asia or Germany every year. The Fields of Vision Festival and the Echt Jetzt! Festival in Reutlingen Tübingen and Stuttgart have developed from this. The artists of the performance art encounter 'The Other Value - Big hugs' have also been to Germany. Monika and I were involved with the performance 'I See You!'.













Laos

Our Asia tours always consist of a mixture of classic travelling and art projects. The transitions are fluid.

We spent the second half of November travelling through Laos. A really classic tourist tour by boat across the Mekong to Luang Prabang and by train to Vientiane. The Mekong tour was special for us because we were able to get to know the Mekong from its origins in China, its course in Laos, its meanders in Cambodia and its end in the river delta of Vietnam. The economic utilisation of the river in China, the dams that the Laotian government is planning and building and the effects of low water levels in Cambodia are all contributing to change in the countries bordering the river. Depending on who benefits and who suffers the damage.













Laos is wonderfully scenic. We are particularly fond of the people in Laos, who are very polite, reserved and yet approachable. Laos is not a rich country. China has a great influence. Much has been bought up by China.

The train we used is a newly inaugurated Chinese-built railway link from southern China to the Laotian capital Vientiane. Sometimes we thought that there were more Chinese in Laos than Laotians.

In a live performance on 6 December, seven strangers will come to give a gift to the land of Nan by walking through Nan and bringing soil from their homeland into the heart of the city. It is a symbolic act to show that we all live on one earth. That we all have a connection to the origin. We are all just visitors, which means we are all strangers in the world, in the country, in the life we have.


