Asiatopia House, Nan

Asiatopiahouse in Nan is a wonderful place built by the artist couple Chumpon and Noi. They have created a place of inspiration through their charismatic personalities. It is a place where people feel welcome, through an interplay of designed nature, architecture, and approachability.

Chumpon, as a person and artist, represents a moving, creative force of contemporary art in Thailand and is one of its most important representatives. Asiatopiahouse was deliberately built in a rural structure. It gives artists the opportunity to live and work temporarily in a village in Thailand where people grow rice and orchids. The artists can participate in village life and spend their time in a quiet environment.

In-salt-a(x)tion

In-salt-a(x)tion is a performance art project whose common denominator is salt. Nan province has been known for centuries for its salt production. In Bo Kluea , 2 hours north of Nan city are the ancient salt wells. The salt water is extracted through draw wells and poured wok pans. Over an open fire, the water evaporates and can be skimmed into baskets.

We know this process from medieval salt production in Germany, for example, from Schwäbisch Hall.

The examination of the element salt has accompanied me since the beginning of the 1990s.

In the exhibition catalog for my exhibition "Body Pieces-Salt Pieces" 1998 Isabella Fehle wrote the following

...... In the history of mankind, peoples ascribed to salt a significance that went far beyond its natural properties. The noblest spice of man was especially valued as an offering. Because of its preservative properties, salt was believed to have magical functions, giving life force to ward off demons. For example, we know the blessing of the house and livestock with salt, salt as a symbol of friendship. While Judaism considers it almost as a bonding agent between God and man, Christianity in the New Testament elevated it to the sign of life and as a symbol of spiritual powers, which can also be seen from the designation of the apostles, "salt of the earth".

Salt protects organic substances from decay. Thus, the ancient Egyptians believed in the protective power of salt against death and in its close connection with life. Salt, according to "Plutarch", possesses divine power through its ability to preserve the bodies of the dead. Salt successfully fights against death and prevents the destruction of the mortal shell. In this context of meaning we have to see the works of Andreas Hoffmann......".

Today, 2 salt springs are in operation in Bo Kluea, Nan for the production of salt. The others are used for ritual purposes.









The artists were able to experience the production of Bo Kluea's salt together on site and transport it from there to the Asiatopiahaus.







From the confrontation with the material, the rural agrarian culture, the vegetation, the atmosphere of the place, the artistic access emerged. Solo performances flowed into group actions on the basis of stimulus and reaction. The result is a 90 -minute performance.




















"New Normal" performance art meeting 2022

A large part of this group we only knew from be a pArt online events. The first time we had a live meeting and a live event. What a difference! The online events in the be a pArt format were a wonderful way to maintain and expand international contacts during the pandemic. It cannot match or replace the quality of a live performance. The real encounter and the real touch in its multiple sense opens completely different dimensions of these artistic actions.
